

# Congress to Hear Of Dam City Plight

The question of providing Boulder City with proper school facilities and necessary governmental machinery for controlling the reservation area will be presented to congress at the next session, according to Walker R. Young, construction engineer on the Boulder Dam project.

These matters will be dealt with in a bill to be introduced on request of the interior department. This measure will outline the definite policy of the department on the various matters under fire, and provide funds for carrying them into execution, Young said.

It is not expected that a high school will be sought for Boulder City, the plan being to pay the local district tuition for all students from within the reservation. Grammar school facilities will in all probability be provided for in the bill, however. The comptroller-general has ruled that Boulder dam funds can be used for the construction of school buildings, and the additional authority will be sought from congress to hire teachers and equip the buildings.

This bill, it is expected, will set up the necessary governmental machinery for the reservation, with provisions made for courts and other law enforcement branches.

There will also be a provision for levying of taxes to raise funds for these various purposes, the government proceeding on the theory that the reservation has been legally established, and as such is beyond the jurisdiction of the state of Nevada.
