

# Fish In Lake Fail To Stay In Water Long

The plans of southern Nevada civic groups for stocking Boulder lake with bass, are in danger of being seriously circumvented by the scores of women and children, who have been bailing the recently planted fingerlings out of the water in buckets, according to Game Warden Wm. E. Mott.

"It is almost unbelievable that any person would do things like this, when we are having so much trouble getting fish to plant in the lake," Mott said. "But they're doing it every day, right out in the open, despite the fact that they can't eat the fish or do anything else with them but throw them out to die."

Mott stated that all persons caught taking the undersized fish out of the lake would be arrested and prosecuted under the Nevada law, which provides a penalty of \$50 to \$500 fine, or 25 days to six months in jail, or both fine and imprisonment. Glen E. Bodell, of Boulder City, is a deputy game warden, and is cooperating with Mott in enforcing the law.
