

\$60,000 FUND FOR ERECTION IS SANCTIONED BY THE SENATE

Deficiency Bill, of Which
Appropriation a Part,
Goes To Conference

OKEH IS PREDICTED

Location of Structure Is
Very Much In Doubt,
Officials Say

WASHINGTON July 24.—
(Special)—Immediate construction of a federal fish hatchery in southern Nevada for the purpose of stocking Boulder lake, was virtually assured today as a result of the approval late last evening by the senate of the second deficiency appropriation bill which carried a \$60,000 allocation for the bureau of fisheries for this purpose.

The amendment was sponsored by Senator Pat McCarran and the Nevada solon expressed gratification at the action of the senate, which he described as "an important step in establishing this great body of water as one of the nation's leading recreational centers."

THE DEFICIENCY bill still must go to conference between the house and senate but approval of the fish hatchery item was a foregone conclusion, Senator McCarran said.

Location of the hatchery is very much in doubt, due to the soil and water requirements, and an official from the bureau is expected to arrive in Las Vegas within the next few days to go over the various proposed sites.

A STREAM of fairly constant flow is needed for the hatchery, officials said, to prevent the possibility of a disastrous shortage of water in the summer season, Senator McCarran explained, adding that the bureau of fisheries has already begun the preliminary work toward start of construction.
