

# LDS Choir To Give Concerts At Dam, Vegas

Las Vegas and Boulder City will be presented with a classic musical treat tomorrow when the LDS tabernacle choir, from Salt Lake City, arrives in this area to give two concerts, one tomorrow morning at the dam, and the other tomorrow afternoon in Las Vegas.

The choir, enroute from the San Diego exposition where they presented musical programs for an entire week, will arrive in Las Vegas tomorrow morning at 8:15, via Union Pacific, and all who have donated autos for the use of the choir are requested to be at the depot not later than eight o'clock.

Upon arrival in Las Vegas the choir will be transported to Boulder City, where they will sing two numbers from on top of the dam. This performance will be recorded by Hearst Metrotone newsreel cameramen, who, according to R. L. Denton, Union Pacific news bureau manager in Los Angeles, are already enroute to Las Vegas for the shot. Denton said this morning that possibly two other newsreel companies would send cameramen here for the musical event at the dam.

After the performance at the dam, the choir will return to Las Vegas for lunch and at four o'clock will present a free concert on the courthouse lawn. Bishop Bryan

Bunker of the Las Vegas LDS church, announced this morning that there would be no collection made at the concert.

The choir is under the management of Bishop David A. Smith and is directed by Albert Southwick with Richard Evans, KSL announcer, doing the announcing for the organization.

The public address system will be hooked up, Bishop Bunker announced, for the announcer and all visitors will be able to hear.

The LDS choir is recognized as one of the finest organizations of its kind in the west, and music lovers of Las Vegas are being presented with a rare musical treat which will not be soon duplicated, Bishop Bunker said today.
