

BOULDERITE TO SUPERVISE ERIE CANAL DREDGING

Leigh G. Cairns, well-known Boulder City man, left the dam community today for Utica, New York, where, as an employe of the Morrison-Knudsen company of Boise, he will be put in charge as construction superintendent of the three-year widening and dredging of the Erie canal job.

Cairns has been a resident of Boulder City for the past four years, during which time he has been in charge of construction of the two spillways, spillway tunnels, and the four intake towers of the Boulder canyon project.
