Dam Game Preserve; Boundaries Given

With the coming of the fall season, hunters are to be reminded of the fact that the area surrounding the Boulder canyon project is now a game preserve.

Government officials today reiterated the fact that the area is now, officially, the Boulder Canyon Wild Life Refuge, under an executive order signed by Herbert Hoover, then president of the United States, on March 27, 1933.

The restricted area contains 500 square miles in the state of Nevada, approximately, and approximately 400 square miles in Arizona. Practically all of the Moapa valley is subject to hunting restrictions as far north as Logandale. The preserve includes a strip $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles below Boulder

dam, and areas on each side of the Colorado river as far north as the Hualpai Indian reservation in Arizona. This territory is under the jurisdiction of the department of the interior, reclamation officials said this morning.

In the executive act proclaiming the wild life refuge, persons are warned against hunting, trapping, capturing any wild animal or bird in the area. Eggs of any wild bird are not to be molested or disturbed, and a warning is issued against cutting, burning, or destroying in any manner timber, underbrush, grass, or other natural growth in the area. Persons are not to willfully disturb, molest, or destroy any property of the United States in the preserve, the order states.
