

DAM DEDICATION TO BE DELAYED 4 OR FIVE DAYS

Pittman Wires Claude
Mackey President's Vis-
it Shifted

Dedication of Boulder dam, originally set for September 26 and later definitely announced for September 28, will be postponed at least "four or five days" from the latter date, Senator Key Pittman wired Claude Mackey, local relief administrator this afternoon.

While no details are available, it is understood that the European crisis has caused the shift in the president's program, and that the date of his departure from the national capital on his western trip will depend entirely on events of the next few days in the war situation.

LATEST INFORMATION is that the president will make but one stop on his way to the coast, and that will be at Boulder dam for the dedicatory services.

President A. S. Henderson of the Las Vegas chamber of commerce contacted Governor Richard Kirman by phone yesterday and requested that he act as host to the visiting dignitaries, and issue an invitation to the governors of the six basin states to be here when the president arrives. The communication would be in the nature of a suggestion that they hold their official calendar open so they can respond to a wire invitation when the date is definitely set.

THE PROGRAM at the dam is in charge of reclamation bureau officials, with Walker R. Young, construction engineer, making preliminary arrangements, and the chamber will work with him, President Henderson said.
