

Bridge at Dam Is Being Ripped Out

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A section of the lower portals road of the Boulder Canyon project, one of the most heavily traveled during early and recent construction days, is now a "road which leads to nowhere."

Six Companies Inc., Boulder dam contractors, is tearing out the 425-foot long steel suspension bridge on which trucks and transports traveled over the lower portals of the two Nevada 50 foot diversion tunnels en route to the base of Boulder dam.

Trucks are now being routed over the steel suspension bridge across the Colorado river instead of the former route along the Nevada wall of Black canyon. Approaches of the old bridge were taken out several days ago as Six Companies Inc., progresses with its work of "cleaning up" equipment which was necessary during the construction period of the Boulder canyon project.
