

Boulder Dam Postage Stamp Will Be Issued on September 28, Revealed

The Boulder dam postage stamp, emblematic of the completion of Boulder dam, will be issued on September 28 in conjunction with the formal dedication of the gigantic project by President Franklin D. Roosevelt, according to word received this morning from the office of Senator Pat McCarran in Washington.

Design for the stamp was submitted by bureau of reclamation engineers in Boulder City, following the adoption by the postoffice department of the idea originally presented by Postmaster F. F. Garside of Las Vegas for issuance of a memorial stamp for this occasion.

Garside said today he had not been officially notified of the issuance of the stamp and did not know whether it would be ready to go on sale in Las Vegas and Boulder City on the 28th or not.

The usual procedure, the postmaster pointed out, is for special stamp issues to be placed on sale the first day in the postoffice of the town nearest the project or event commemorated. If this practice is followed in this instance, the stamps would be sold in Boulder City on the 28th but would not go on sale in other postoffices until the following day, Garside explained.
