

# 200 TEACHERS TO COME TO VEGAS FOR INSTITUTE

To Be Principal Speaker

More than 200 school teachers are expected to arrive in Las Vegas today to attend the fifth district teachers' institute in the state, other meetings having previously been held at Elko, Winnemucca, Reno and Ely, according to Miss Maude Frazier, superintendent of the Las Vegas schools.

Dr. Rufus von Klein Smid, president of the University of Southern California, who is widely known as one of the leading educators in the west and an interesting speaker, will be the featured speaker of the institute program. He will talk on "Understanding World Neighbors" at 9 o'clock Thursday morning at the high school.

ANOTHER IMPORTANT speaker who will be here for the meetings is Dr. N. C. Hanks of the vocational department of Washington, who will discuss "Teachers' Associations and Institutes."

With the opening of the institute in Las Vegas tomorrow, the visiting teachers will attend the classes of the local high school, which, according to Miss Frazier, will be carried on as usual, giving the instructors from other localities an opportunity to observe teaching methods in use here.

A CONCERT, in which the Las Vegas, Bunkerville and Overton bands will participate, will be presented at 7:30 o'clock tomorrow evening in the high school gymnasium. Other features on the program will be dancing numbers by the physical education classes of Las Vegas under the direction of Miss Gwen Woolley and Miss Evelyn Chapp.

A trip to Boulder dam will be the feature of the entertainment on Wednesday's program.

Thursday's program will be devoted to speakers and special section meeting, ending with a tea to be given by the Las Vegas faculty from 4 until 6 o'clock.

FOLLOWING the close of Friday's meeting, a football game in which the Las Vegas Wildcats will meet the Kingman, Arizona, team, will be played on Butcher field at 2:30 o'clock.

"The public is invited and even urged to attend the teachers' institute," Miss Frazier announced this morning. "It is an opportunity to see how the schools are operated and to hear some of the outstanding educators speak."

The registration of the visiting teachers will be held in the department of education office in the Clark county court house beginning at 8 o'clock tomorrow morning.
