

GUEST HOUSE OF SIX COMPANIES IS GIVEN ITS FIRST 'HOUSE WARMING'

New Spanish Structure On Hilltop Completed and Put Into Use

HAS SIX BEDROOMS

Prominent Financier Is Guest First Night; Directors "Visit."

The guest house of Six Companies is finished, and was given an informal "house warming" last night by a notable group, including directors of Six Companies and Mr. and Mrs. Mortimer Fleishacker of San Francisco, who were there as guests of Felix Kahn, treasurer of Six Companies.

Fleishacker is well known and prominent in coast financial circles, being president of the Anglo-California Trust company of California.

Located atop the knoll just west of the water tank hill, the guest house commands a full view of both Boulder City and Heminway wash with the "lake" bed in the background.

The structure is attractive Spanish design, finished in white stucco on the exterior, and with an attractive patio facing east. It has a tile roof.

The building, which finished just yesterday, is to house directors and officials of Six Companies during their visits to Boulder City, and also guests whom they might wish to entertain there.

There are six bedrooms, a large living room with arched doorway to the dining room, kitchen and servants' headquarters.

The entire interior is furnished with exquisite taste, furniture, of a modified Monterey type, harmonizing beautifully with the architecture. W. H. Pollard, Jr., of Oakland, was responsible for this work.

Air conditioning system and large open fireplace add to the comfort and cheer of the house.
