Senator Pat McCarran, junior senator from Nevada, will be the featured speaker of the triple fete to be celebrated here tomorrow evening at 7 o'clock in the War Memorial building, commemorating the arrival of Boulder dam power in Las Vegas, the twenty-sixth birthday of the city government, and the annual meeting of the chamber of commerce.

A gigantic parade on the streets of Las Vegas will be the initial feature of the evening, followed by a dinner party at the War Memorial building and dance.

Miss Doris Dudley, screen and stage star who has just finished the picture "The Woman Rebels" with Katharine Hepburn, will attend the dance at a special guest. She will arrive here tomorrow afternoon by Western Air Express, accompanied by her husband, Jack Jenkins.

MEMBERS OF the senior and junior chambers of commerce will form a reception committee to greet a special delegation from the Pasadena, California, senior and junior chambers there.

Besides Senator McCarran the other speakers at the dinner will be: R. G. Knickerbocker, engineer in charge of the electro-metallurgical laboratory in Boulder City; Thomas Wolfe, vice-president in charge of traffic for the Western Air Express; Don Thomas, managing director of the All-Year club of southern California; and Charles Howarth, field director of the All-Year club.

ONE OF THE features of the dinner will be the showing of a colored film by Thomas Wolfe, portraying the Las Vegas-Boulder dam-Grand Canyon area as the scenic wonderland and the playground of the southwest.

dance will be held, beginning at 9:30 o'clock.

The parade will be held at 6 o'clock, it has been announced by those in charge. The parade will form on South Third street, at the rear of the Clark county courthouse at 5:30 o'clock and will proceed down Carson to Main street, down Main to Fremont, and thence to the War Memorial building down North Fifth street.

Leading the parade will be the American Legion color guard, followed by the Las Vegas city officials, the Alamo band, chamber of commerce officials, Boy Scouts with the Kiwanis club float, Las Vegas high school band, Camp Fire girls and Rotary club float, Sons of the American Legion, American Legion drum corps, industrial and business floats, the city equipment, the city band, a display of new automobile models by various Las Vegas car dealers and the Las Vegas Horsemen's association, mounted on their spirited horses and clad in Helldorado costume.

The El Portal Electric company has donated its loudspeaker for use in the parade.

INVITATIONS have been sent to various groups in cities adjacent to Las Vegas to send delegations to Las Vegas to join in the triple fete here.

Senator McCarran will arrive here tomorrow afternoon from Reno with A. R. Thompson, PWA engineer and former resident of Las Vegas.

The senator wired today to A. C. Grant in Las Vegas, "Leaving here with Thompson early tomorrow morning to be with people of Las Vegas on occasion of their celebration."
