

# Boulder Dam Waterfall Spouts Tonight Beginning At 8 o'Clock

The Nevada waterfall of Boulder Dam's Niagara, will definitely go into action tonight at eight o'clock, when all six valves in the outlet works are opened to allow water from Boulder Lake to go booming forth to create one of the most sensational spectacles to be seen anywhere in the United States.

The change in the hour from seven to eight was announced by bureau of reclamation officials today to conform to the wishes of news-reel cameramen who will be on deck to film the spurting water under the lights of the

recently installed illuminating system.

A test was scheduled to be made this afternoon at 1:15 for a fifteen minute period to allow the film men to spot their shots, and plans call for the water to be on for a full hour tonight, being cut off promptly at nine o'clock.

The outlet works are used to by-pass water from Boulder Lake around the power houses for release to the communities downstream. The purpose tonight, however, is entirely to produce a spectacle for the benefit of the
