

# Boulder City Rifle Team Wins Civilian Team Test In Lovelock

Team honors in the annual rifle club meet held in Lovelock last week-end went to the Boulder City team, which scored a total of 828 points out of a possible 1000, according to the reports received here today following the return of the team.

The Marine team of Hawthorne, which was entered in the competition, scored only slightly higher than the Boulder City team, but in the civilian club competition, Boulder City led.

G. C. "Buck" Blaine, only member on the Boulder City team who was from Las Vegas, made the highest score for the team with 171 out of 200. Other team members and their scores were: M. O. Dodge, second with 168; A. G. Boynton, third with 163; L. Hudlow, fourth with 161; and H. Paige, fifth with 158.

They competed with 10 shots each in the following events: 200 yards, offhand; 200 yards rapid fire; 300 yards rapid fire; and 600 yards prone.

A return match with the Haw-

thorne Marines is scheduled to be held with the Boulder City team early in July.

In the long range, 1000 yards, free rifle competition, a three-way tie was settled by a reverse count to decide the winner, and E. A. Woodward of Winnemucca was awarded the honor. However, Blaine of Las Vegas and Dodge of Boulder City each had the same score of 97 points in the match. Blaine placed second in the reverse count and received a silver medal in recognition for his ability.

Dodge won the Dewar small bore championship with a score of 384 and received a cash prize of \$20. Ben Bowles of Reno placed second and Paige of Boulder City was third in this match.

The individual high score for the meet, in which teams from Carson City, Fallon, Gardnerville, Reno, Lovelock, Winnemucca, and Boulder City competed for the three-day shoot, went to Woodward of Winnemucca with a score of 187.
