

# Guide At Dam Is Hero of Rescue As Elevator In Structure Jams

When the Arizona elevator at the Stony Gate on the Boulder Canyon project became lodged between the second and third floors last night, four tourists and their guide, Bill Older of Las Vegas, faced the possibility of spending the night in the suspended cage, until Older came to the rescue and climbed out of the trap at the top of the elevator and made his way up the shaft to the landing to get help.

Older had taken Mr. and Mrs. Claud Lenz and son, Paul, and niece, Lois Lenz, of Chicago, to view the project and had started up in the elevator in the Stony Gate near the Arizona valve house, when the safety guide went on automatically about 10 o'clock last night

Older was unable to get the elevator in motion again, and when the yells of the entire party failed to attract the attention of anyone in the vicinity, Older climbed out the top and up to the next floor.

Electricians were called and were unable to get the elevator started at once, and it was decided that the entire party would have to leave the elevator in the same manner as Older had done.

Electricians worked on the elevator for more than an hour before getting it in working order again.

In the meantime, however the stranded passengers had been removed through the top of the elevator and had proceeded on their tour of inspection of the project.
