

# NOTED ELECTRIC ERECTOR PASSES

Lidwig Schlatterer, 58, widely known erecting engineer for the General Electric company, who has been working on the Boulder dam project for the past two years, passed away yesterday from a heart attack at his home in Boulder City.

A veteran erector of electrical equipment, Schlatterer had been in the employ of the General Electric company for the past 37 years, having been engaged in construction activities in Russia, Mexico, South Africa and other foreign countries.

He came to Boulder City in September, 1935, and has been engaged in installing the world's largest transformers in the Boulder dam powerhouses, and since the completion of that job, had been assembling and erecting two huge generators which his company built for the dam project.

His body, which is at the Garrison Mortuary in Las Vegas, will be sent to Pittsfield, Massachusetts tomorrow for burial.

A widow and two daughters, one aged 18 and the other aged 16, survive him, residing in Pittsfield.

Schlatterer had been ill for the past three or four days, doctors said, but his condition was not considered alarming. He was stricken with the heart attack yesterday morning and succumbed shortly afterward.
