

# Boulder Dam Engineer Leaving For South American Position

G. H. "Red" Moore, electrical inspector for the bureau of reclamation on Boulder dam, and a veteran of the project since 1932, will leave next Saturday on another of his periodical jaunts to foreign lands where he has spent much of his adult life as an engineer.

Moore is slated to take over the installation of a 20,000 steam-electric plant at Maracaibo, Venezuela, about the first of December and will sail from New York City on November 15, he said today.

While there, Moore will be in the employ of the J. D. White

Corporation, large electrical contracting firm of New York.

After two years and a half in South America, Moore expects to leave for China to supervise the installation of an 18,000 kw plant at Lung Chi Ho, in the western part of the empire, which is being constructed under the direction of Yu Hsien Huang, a former engineering associate of Moore's with Stone Webster Corporation in Boston.

In his letter to Moore, Huang declares the Japanese war will not interfere with the project which is to cost \$6,500,000 in Chinese dollars.
