

Western States To See Building of Boulder Dam on Silver Screen

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 23. (UP)—All residents of 10 western states who missed the construction of Boulder dam, which proceeded down in the deep gorge formed by the towering walls of Black canyon, will be able to get a glimpse on the silver screen of what was done during the life of the project by the workmen who toiled in the hot summer sun of the southern Nevada desert area.

It took the workmen five years to construct the barrier across the Colorado river, but theater-goers will be able to see the entire project grow before their eyes in about 30 minutes.

Variety, film and radio paper, said today that the story of conquering the Colorado, a four reeler produced under the supervision of the department of the interior, will be distributed in 10 western states by Monogram Pictures of California, Inc. It will be sold at regular film rentals as a semi-feature picture, the magazine said.

According to all information available, the picture is the same one that has been displayed for the past several years at Boulder City by the government, but the release thru Monogram Pictures will be brot up to date and sound effects worked in.
