

De Armond Arrives To Take Up Boulder Dam Power Duties Here

Prepared to start work immediately on the various problems confronting the Colorado River commission in connection with distribution of Boulder dam power, construction of a water system to bring water from Boulder lake into Las Vegas valley, and interesting industrial plants in locating here, C. F. DeArmond, newly appointed engineer for the commission, arrived in Las Vegas last night to remain permanently.

DeArmond has been on the job since the first of the year, spending the earlier part of the month in Los Angeles in conference with officials of the bureau of power and light ironing out various phases of the withdrawal and

turnback of power by the state of Nevada.

The engineer plans to open an office in Las Vegas, and start at once outlining his work program for the next few months.

Ed W. Clark, southern Nevada member of the commission, returned last night from Los Angeles after attending the conferences, and spent today conferring with DeArmond on details of the opening of offices here.

Both stated that there are many intricate details of Nevada's power contracts which must be worked out immediately before any other matters are tackled, and DeArmond plans to devote much of his time in the beginning to that phase of the commission endeavor.
