

Babcock - Wilcox Dormitory Is Bought By Los Angeles Bureau

The former Babcock and Wilcox dormitory at the corner of Avenue A and Cherry street in Boulder City has been purchased by the bureau of power and light of Los Angeles to be used to house employes who are expected to be stationed in Boulder City during

the construction of the third power line from the dam to southern California, according to Sims Ely, city manager.

The dormitory has been the property of Harold Anderson, who formerly operated the mess hall for the Six Companies, Inc., employes in Boulder City, and possession will be turned over to the bureau of power and light by the first of the year, the city manager said.

The building will be operated both as a dormitory and mess hall for the bureau of power and light employes, it is reported.

Reports that the bureau of power and light is planning to construct shops on the south side of town could not be confirmed in Boulder City.

The bureau of power and light now is stringing a telephone line from Boulder City to Los Angeles, in preparation for the third power line planned, it is reported.
