

# Boulder Hospital

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## Work Progressing

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Boulder City soon will have its own hospital. In a beautiful hilltop setting, with curved drives, shrubbery and lawns, the hospital is nearing completion. Work on the interior is progressing.

The building, which was built by the Six Companies, Inc., and later was used as national park service offices, now is being returned to its original use.

The main floor consists of office, reception room, delivery and pre-delivery rooms, nursery, doctors' and nurses' rest rooms, laboratory and operating room. There are five private rooms, one three-bed ward, one of four beds, and five two-bed wards. Modern equipment for the X-ray room is being installed. There is also a dark room for developing films. In addition there is the diet kitchen, linen room, service kitchen and a modern sterilizer.

In the basement there is the large kitchen containing three double sinks, a 66-cubic foot capacity refrigerator, three complete preparation units, each equipped with an electric range, and a dumb waiter for service to the main floor. Next is the storage room, nurses' dining room, linen storage room, two rest rooms for the hospital help and a large laundry room.

The same heating system is being used, but much of the air conditioning system was salvaged from the old CCC barracks.

The original flooring is being replaced in some sections of the building with asphalt tile. Work on the building was started about June 7. This hospital will be modern and up-to-date in every respect, even to the tinting of the walls.

According to Rupert Spearman, the main problem now is the procuring of the necessary medical and utility equipment.
