

GOVERNMENT'S HOUSE BUILDING PROGRAM AT B. C. NEARLY FINISHED

Bengtson Soon to Finish
29 Frame Homes; L. A.
Firm Working on 30

TOTAL OF 100 HOUSES

Hundred Families, 70 Sin-
gle Men Provided for by
Residences, Dorms

With a contract for construc-
tion of 29 new frame homes for
the Bureau of Reclamation near-
ing completion, and another for
30 three-room homes likewise in
progress, an even hundred gov-
ernment homes soon will have
been erected in Boulder City.

Forty-one homes, mostly of
brick and permanent construction,
have been built on various con-
tracts and are occupied at the
present time by government em-
ployes.

Contractors Bengtson and Son
are due to finish their contract for
17 three-room and 12 four-room
homes late this week. Those on
Utah, Arizona and Avenue I have
been nearly completed. The others
are on Denver, Park, and Park
Place.

Among Reclamation men who re-
cently have moved into their new
homes are Edward L. Sutherland,

Roy L. Shipp, Harold V. Jenkins, Smith S. Evans, Charles C. Darden, Albert L. Moser and E. C. Boring.

Alonzo A. Brownson, Cecil D. Scott and John L. Newell will be moving soon into their new homes on Utah street.

The De Camp, Hudson company, Ltd., of Los Angeles is engaging construction of 30 three room frame residences, nine of which are on Avenue B, northeast of Nevada boulevard, 2 on Avenue L, one on Avenue I, four on the south side of Colorado street, 10 at the east end of Arizona street and four on Avenue K.

Thirty-seven brick homes are now occupied by government men, and four frames, on previous contracts. With the 59 under the Bengtson and De Camp Hudson contracts added, the total becomes 100 even.

The present government dormitory has a capacity for 36 men, and the new one to be built immediately just east of the municipal building by William Bickell and company will house 34, making a total capacity of 70 men in the two federal men's dorms.

Thus the government will have furnished housing facilities for 100 families and 70 single men.
