

# Bullhead Town Papers Are Filed

This week a map was filed with the board of supervisors for approval. The map is of the Bullhead townsite situated about three miles south of the site of the Davis dam at Bullshead canyon and on the county road between the dam site and Oatman. The survey of the townsite was made in December, 1941, and the owners, W. J. Lee, Irene M. Lee, W. H. Long and Ida M. Long, made affidavit of ownership and dedication of the streets in March, 1942.

The survey and map were made by Engineer L. H. Foster. The map of Unit No. 1, as it is designated, shows about 90 lots lying between Second and Third streets which traverse nearly north and south. The cross streets are named Riverside Drive, Main, Moser, Long and Lee streets.

The probable camp site for the reclamation service is situated a short distance north of the townsite and between it and the dam site. Murl Emery, who owns and conducts the ferry service across the Colorado river just below the site of the Davis dam, is largely interested in the new townsite venture and is reported to have planned the erection of a number of rental buildings. It is generally conceded that the actual construction of the Davis dam will commence within a very short time and when this work starts there will be considerable business activity in the area because the advent of several hundred men, and possibly many families, into the district.
