

WILBUR OKEYS HIGHWAY WORK IN MESA VERDE

J. S. to Spend \$110,000
Surfacing 7.43 Miles of
Road in Western Colo-
rado Park; Rocky Moun-
tain Gets \$65,500

WASHINGTON, March 10 (AP)—
Secretary Wilbur today approved
allocation by the park service of
its 1932 road fund of \$5,300,000, the
bulk of which was appropriated by
congress as a lump sum.

The money becomes available im-
mediately, under provisions permit-
ting its use to help relieve unem-
ployment.

Director Albright submitted the
allotments to Wilbur yesterday.
Construction will be under the di-
rection of the bureau of public roads
and the park service.

The fund will be divided as fol-
lows for roads, trails, improving ex-
isting routes and purchasing equip-
ment:

Grand canon, Arizona, roads 39.98
miles, including south approach
road and surveys, \$343,800.

Mesa Verde, Colo., surfacing 7.43
miles, \$110,000.

Rocky mountains, Colorado, sur-
veys, \$8,000.

Director Albright notified Thomas
H. Macdonald, chief of the bureau
of public roads, to undertake the
projects immediately.

Grand canon, minor roads, \$5,000;
Mesa Verde, \$10,500; Rocky moun-
tain, \$57,500.

Miscellaneous work on several
national monuments in the south-
west \$40,000.
