

U. S. to Spend \$2,000,000 to House Boulder Workers

WASHINGTON, March 8.—Expenditures for the health and comfort of workers on the Boulder Dam will cost the federal government nearly \$2,000,000, a statement issued by Ellwood Mead, commissioner of reclamation, predicted. Mr. Mead's bulletin described the model town of Boulder City which is to be built to house 3,000 people. The government will construct a town hall, garage, dormitory, school, guest house, auditorium, administration building, seventy-five cottages, fifty small garages, a swimming pool and a playground.
