

BIDS RECEIVED FOR BUILDING GREATEST DAM

UTAH CONSTRUCTION COMPANY
IS ONE OF GROUP SUBMIT-
TING LOW FIGURE

Reclamation Commissioner Mead Wednesday recommended to Secretary Wilbur that the low bid of \$48,890,995.50 of Six Companies, Inc., for the construction of Hoover dam and power house on the Colorado river be accepted.

Low bid for the construction of the Hoover dam, power plant and appurtenant works, submitted Wednesday to the U. S. reclamation service at Denver, Colo., was offered by Six Companies, Inc., of San Francisco. The bid was \$49,890,995.50. Three bids were received.

The other two bids were:

Arundel corporation of Baltimore, Md., \$53,893,878.70.

Woods Brothers corporation, Lincoln, Neb., \$58,653,107.50.

The Six Companies, Inc. consists of the Utah Construction company of San Francisco and Ogden; Henry J. Kaiser and W. A. Bethel & company of San Francisco; McDonald and Kahn, Ltd., of San Francisco; Morris, Knudsell & Co. of Boise, Ida.; Shea company, Portland, Ore., and the Pacific Bridge company of Portland.

The low bid was presented by W. H. Wattis, president of the Six Companies, and was accompanied by bond for \$2,000,000 issued by the Fidelity and Deposit company of Maryland.
