## Law to Be Attacked

Roger Foley, Counsel for Bill Wallace, to Launch Attack

An attack on the state law which gives the city of Las Vegas power to enact legislation looking to the enforcement of liquor restrictions within one mile of the city limits, is contemplated as a result of the arrest last evening of William Wallace following a raid on a building occupied by him adjoining the Salt Lake highway at the entrance to the Youngquist Addition, it was revealed by Deputy District Attorney Roger Foley who has been retained to handle Wallace's case.

Several raids have been made on the Wallace establishment by city officers, but each time there has been no evidence uncovered.

Last evening, however, the raiding squad, under the leadership of Dott Smith, served a search warrant and found a considerable amount of alleged whiskey in the goose-neck of the sink, where officers claim Wallace dumped his supply of liquor upon their approach.

Wallace was released on bond provided by property owners in the North Las Vegas area, and immediately retained Foley to fight the case.

Foley said he was looking into the law covering the matter, and that when he goes into court on Friday, he expects to attack the constitutionality of the charter provision giving the city jurisdiction over that area.

Wallace declared to friends this morning that he intends to fight the case thru to the supreme court, if necessary in order to determine whether or not the city actually has jurisdiction beyond the corporate limits.
