

ADMINISTRATION AND MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS DONE

Garage Work Started;
Home Construction Is
Progressing Fast

Construction of the government administration and municipal buildings in Boulder City has been completed, and the structures soon will be ready for occupancy.

The administration building, of Spanish architecture, is of stucco and terra cotta with an attractive red tile roof, and with interior in Spanish motif with hardwood paneling and fine floors.

The date at which Walker R. Young, construction engineer for the bureau of reclamation, and his staff will move their offices there from Las Vegas has not been released as yet for publication.

A few remaining "tag ends" in the matter of equipment and furnishings, are being completed in both structures.

The municipal building will be occupied by the city manager's office, the police force and the post office.

White and Alter of Elko have finished the formwork for footings for the government garage and fire house.

H. F. Bengston has done a week's work on starting of construction of 29 frame houses for the government.

Brick work, tile roofing and other construction phases of the six and seven-room homes for officials of the bureau are under way and progressing rapidly.
