

Two More Blanket Thieves Arrested

An organized traffic in the wool blankets furnished by the Six Companies to their employees, has been successfully broken up with the arrest in Los Angeles yesterday of Morris Ram and Jack Tolliver on a charge of possessing stolen property, it was stated today by Bud Bodell, chief of police of Boulder City.

Blankets were traced from the reservation city to the coast where they had been sold and also given away as Christmas presents, Bodell said, the arrest of Ram and Tolliver following the discovery of several blankets, sheets and pillow cases in a rooming house in Pasadena.

Chief Bodell states that he has additional information regarding the theft of blankets, and that more arrests are to be made in the near future. He states he also has information where a number of blankets are located and expects to recover them within a few days.

Search warrants are expected to be issued for residences and auto camps along the highway leading to Boulder City, Bodell said.

The blankets are worth \$5.50 each and since the arrest of five individuals for stealing them from the dormitories and the discharge of several employees of the company, many have been returned to police headquarters by individuals who said they did not know they were stolen.

"Anyone who has any of the blankets can return them to police headquarters and no questions will be asked," Bodell said.

Over 100 blankets have been stolen to date, the chief stated.
