

WILL OPERATE TO SAVE LIFE OF CAR UPSET VICTIM IN B. C.

Frank Lehman, Employee
Of Six Companies, Has
Back Broken Sunday

~~OTHERS RECOVERING~~

Await Arrival of Leh-
man's Relatives Before
Undertaking Operation

With the life of Frank Lehman, whose back was broken in an automobile accident Sunday near Railroad pass, hanging in the balance, physicians at the Boulder City hospital, where he is lying in serious condition, plan to operate on Lehman's spine in attempt to save his life.

They are waiting, however, for the arrival from Los Angeles of near relatives of the injured man, before undertaking the dangerous operation.

Lehman's wife, less seriously injured in the same accident, was taken yesterday from the hospital to the Lehman home on Avenue C, where she is confined to bed recovering from her injuries.

All the other injured persons also have been discharged from the hospital, where their hurts were dressed. They are H. B. Lawton, who suffered a broken left forearm and cuts; John Hawkins, who suffered cuts about the head, necessitating the taking of several stitches and Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Dawes.

The accident happened while the party were en route toward Las Vegas for a holiday trip. It was while the sedan in which they were riding was passing a stage that the car went off the road, where graveling work has been in process, turning over and hurling some of its occupants clear out of the machine according to best information available today.

The car, owned by Hawkins, was badly damaged, the top being virtually demolished.

Lehman is an employe of Six Companies Inc.; A. J. Dawes is a shovel runner for Six Companies, and charter member of the Boulder Legion post; Harry Lawton is vice commander of the Boulder Legion post.
