

AUTO ACCIDENT VICTIM DIES ABOUT MIDNIGHT

Mother in Hospital in L. A. Suffering Broken Bones As Result of Sec- ond Crash in Tragic Series

Frank Lehman died at about midnight last night, death caused by a fracture of the twelfth dorsal vertebra.

Meanwhile, his mother, injured in an auto accident as she started from Los Angeles to the bedside of her dying son, lies in a hospital in Los Angeles, suffering a broken ankle, broken arm and cracked collar bone.

Lehman was injured late Saturday night in an automobile accident in which six persons were injured near Railroad Pass, when the automobile of John V. Hawkins, driven by H. B. Lawton, went off the highway as it was passing a bus en route to Las Vegas.

Learning of her son's serious condition, Lehman's mother and his two brothers prepared immediately to come to the bedside of the Six Company man in Boulder City.

As their car was being backed out of the garage, another car came along and crashed into theirs, wrecking it and injuring Mrs. Lehman.

She was rushed to a hospital in Los Angeles.

The two brothers of deceased came on to Boulder City.

Lehman's body is at the Parks Mortuary chapel in Boulder City, and funeral arrangements will be announced later.

The American Legion will conduct the funeral for Frank Lehman, and the services will be held this afternoon at five o'clock at the Parks Mortuary in Boulder City.

Burial will be at Woodlawn cemetery in Las Vegas.
