

# Famous Indian Actress Arrives

Rose Marie, famous Osage-Apache Indian motion picture actress and lecturer, arrived in Las Vegas yesterday and will become a member of the staff at the new Apache hotel, and casino.

Rose Marie, who spent her childhood in Ponca City, Oklahoma, was educated in Western Reserve college, Cleveland, and has devoted several years of her life to lecturing on different Indian tribes throughout the country.

As a motion picture actress she played leading roles in such productions as "The Land of the Navajo," "When an Indian Loves," and Zane Grey's "Vanishing American."

Injured in an automobile accident near San Ceminlo, California, two years ago, Rose Marie was declared by her physician to be so badly injured that recovery was

doubtful. Badly cut about the head and lips, and suffering dislocated hips she was confined to a hospital for several months before she was able to move about. Fortunately, the accident left no scars on her head or face, but she still suffers at times from body injuries sustained.

Exquisite hand-made Indian beadwork, on which Rose Marie has devoted several years' work, will be on display in the Apache hotel lobby tonight, she announced today.
