

Probabilities Are That a  
Precinct Will Be Put at  
Midway

3 NEW ONES HERE

One in North Las Vegas,  
One in Southern Area  
and One Downtown

Preparations to establish the Boulder Canyon reservation as still more surely a part of the State of Nevada, will be made at the next regular meeting of the boards of county commissioners, when voting precincts to take care of those eligible to cast their ballot, will be created.

Present plans call for the establishment of two precincts within Boulder City and one at the river camp. Probabilities are that a fourth will be authorized at Midway City, and possibly another at Whitney.

"WE HAVE never conceded one single bit of jurisdiction to the federal government," district attorney Harley A. Harmon declared this morning in commenting on the matter. "And we most certainly take the stand that the reservation is part of Clark County. Since it is, then its qualified residents most certainly have a right to vote, and the county plans to go ahead with plans for establishing regular precincts there."

Just how many eligible voters will be added to the county rolls could not be estimated, because of the residence requirement of six months in the state, thirty days in the county and ten days in the precinct. The state residence requirement is expected to cut the number of voters to about half of the number of residents within the reservation, and perhaps even further than that, close observers declare.

IN ADDITION to these precincts, two or three new ones are expected to be created within the city of Las Vegas, one in North Las Vegas, one in the southern portion of the city, and one to pick up the excess in congested sections of the downtown portion of town.

The boundaries for all new precincts will be established at the next session of the county board.
