WASHINGTON, May 31. —

Unexpected opposition which has sprung up within the California delegation may kill the chances of his bill to provide for the taxation of private property on the Boulder dam reservation, Congressman Samuel S. Arentz said today.

He pointed out that since the bill is on the consent calendar only one vote will be necessary to block its passage. Because of the brevity of time he does not expect to have a chance to get it on the regular calendar for discussion and a vote.

ARENTZ ACCUSED contractors on the reservation of using their influence in opposition to the bill. This is reflected in the attitude of the California congressman who appear determined to oppose the bill, he said. More opposition from other sections that are the headquarters of contractors on the federal work can be expected now, he said.

His only hope, if the bill is killed when it comes up for the unanimous consent, is to have it considered as an emergency measure. An argument for this consideration he will use figures to show that Las Vegas and Clark county are taking care of many persons that were attracted by the prospect of work on the dam, and that these are having to educate many children belonging to both the employed of the reservation and the unemployed that were attracted by the promise of work on it.
