To look back in retrospection and see exactly how those four 56 foot diversion tunnels on the Hoover dam project were drilled in one single year's time is now eminently appropriate and worth while, to engineers and laymen alike, to Hoover Dam worker and to resident afar.

Such a retrospection will be made possible for Boulder City Journal readers during this week thru an authoritative article to be reproduced, beginning tomorrow from a recent issue of Compressed Air magazine, written by Norman S. This article tells how enough solid rock was excavated in a bare twelve months by the contractors to lay a stone wall a foot thick and a yard high from coast to coast.
