

# Dam Workman Is Badly Injured

Louis E. Johnson, Boulder dam carpenter, was in a critical condition in the Boulder City hospital today, suffering from internal injuries and shock and bruises, as the result of a fall at the project yesterday.

Johnson fell approximately six feet when he slipped off the Arizona power house, and was impaled on a piece of re-enforcing steel. The steel entered his body just above the hip, lacerating his kidney and injuring the pelvis bone.

Dr. R. O. Schofield, who attended the injured man, said that an operation would be necessary to determine the full extent of his injuries.

At an early hour this morning, Rudy Kiethchler, form stripper, is said to have fallen nearly 30 feet while at work on the Arizona wing of the same structure. He is at the Boulder City hospital suffering from head injuries, a possible fracture of the skull.

John Bray, carpenter's helper, in some manner, tangled with a truck owned by Six Companies Inc., on the job, and is being treated at the Boulder City hospital for a fracture of the left foot. The truck, according to reports, is said to have run over Bray's foot.

Al Kukrel, employe of Six Companies Inc., who was impaled upon a reinforcing rod when the skip traveling the downstream side of the dam dropped, while carrying a load of men, was released the same day Johnson, who suffered a similar accident, was admitted.
