

CLARK COUNTY MAY GET \$40,000 IN TAXES AT DAM

Arentz Hopeful That Col-
lection May be Made
During Fiscal Year.

WASHINGTON, June 21.—

Clark county still has a good chance of getting approximately \$40,000 in taxes from the Boulder Dam reservation during the next fiscal year, Congressman Samuel Arentz said today.

Arentz made this prediction in spite of the fact that his bill to permit the state and county to collect taxes on the reservation definitely has been killed insofar as the present session of congress is concerned. He based the prophesy on the hope that he would be successful in obtaining passage of the bill during the second session which assembles in December.

Formerly Arentz said that the county would have no chance to obtain taxes during the 1933 fiscal year, which begins July 1, unless the bill were passed before that time. He said today, however, that he sees no reason why taxes on the reservation cannot be collected for a part of the fiscal year much the same way as sheep taxes are often collected for only part of a year.

"And if the bill should pass there is always the poll tax to be considered," he said. "This could be collected at any time, and should amount to about \$26,000. I see no reason why the property taxes could not be collected for the part of the year that will remain after the time I hope to get my bill passed."

THE TAX bill will stay on the congressional calendar and will be one of the first things to be studied when congress convenes in December.
