

# ROSEN, FISCHEL IS LOW BIDDER ON JOB, TO START ABOUT JULY 15TH

Illinois Company Submits  
\$214,709 Estimate to  
Complete Work

## 20 BIDS TURNED IN

Automatic Sprinkling  
System May Be Placed  
for the Grounds

WASHINGTON, June 28.  
(Special)—Unless there is a bid  
delayed in the mails as was the  
case when the first contract was  
let to the Plains Construction  
company of Pampa, Texas, the  
new Las Vegas federal building  
will be built by Rosen and Fis-  
chel, Incorporated, Chicago con-  
tractors it was indicated this af-  
ternoon with the opening of  
bids in the office of the super-  
vising architect of the treasury  
department.

The Chicago firm submitted a  
bid of \$214,709 to complete con-  
struction of the building started  
last fall by the Texas firm, but  
never carried beyond the prelimin-  
ary stage.

ROSEN AND FISCHEL sub-  
mitted the \$214,709 bid for com-  
pleting the structure as per the  
original specifications, or \$220,533  
if the floor levels are all raised 18  
inches as was called for in an al-  
ternate bid.

The bid submitted is \$22,291 less  
than that of \$237,000 for which the  
Plains Construction company  
agreed to construct the building  
complete.

TWENTY BIDS were submitted  
on the structure, those of Herbert  
N. Baruch Corporation of Los An-  
geles specifying \$222,940 and  
\$226,540 for the two proposals,  
being second low and the Bannister-  
Field company, also of Los An-  
geles third with bids of \$228,900  
and \$234,300 respectively.
