Boulder City, according to the Los Angeles Examiner, is front page news.

For an editorial in yesterday's issue ends with the comment that "progress anywhere these days is front page news." Boulder City certainly is the very spirit of progress.

Reference had been made to the recent Apache hotel edition of the Review-Journal, and the Examiner editorial writer swings the Hoover dam project into the picture in a way that is striking, referring in an interesting manner to the huge elevators to be used in construction of the dam.
