

Dam Worker Faces Reservation Ouster

D. W. Painter, truck driver for the Six Companies Inc., faces expulsion from the reservation and the possibility of a charge of liquor possession, according to reservation police. Painter was arrested early this morning for driving too fast thru the reservation gate.

At 12:15, mid-night, he drove out of the reservation gate at a speed that was close to 60 miles an hour on the left side of the road, officers in charge testified. The officer at the gate shouted for him to stop. Painter came back and his car was searched. Three-fourths of a pint of liquor, several empty bottles, and bottles of soft drink were found in the car. Officers said Painter had been drinking.

Painter has no family and has been living at 324 South Second street, Las Vegas, and has been working for the Six Companies since September 1931. He will be brought before the United States Commissioner W. J. Flowers, and he will decide upon the charge to be made against Painter.
