

WILL DECIDE B. C. SCHOOL QUESTIONS

Boulder City's much discussed school questions will probably be settled during the first week of September, it was revealed by authoritative sources yesterday.

It was learned that the question will be discussed by a joint meeting between the Six Companies executive committee, Boulder City Manager Sims Ely, and Construction Engineer Walker R. Young, to be held some time after September 1.

The school building, located across the street from the municipal building, is already nearly completed under a government contract, and will be ready for enrollments by September 25, according to the construction schedule.

Under the Six Companies contract, following government specifications, the contractors are paying a flat sum of \$5000 monthly for ground rent, sewer, water and light privileges, and other Boulder City facilities furnished by the government.

It is thought that the discussion between the contractors and government officials will decide whether this flat rate will include the furnishing of educational facilities, at government expense, or whether Six Companies will pay additional funds toward the operation of the school.

Regardless of the outcome of the meeting, however, school facilities in Boulder City will be available, possibly on a tuition basis, it was indicated by officials yesterday.
