

LOW BIDDER ON BOULDER SCHOOL IS I. M. BAY, OF JUNCTION, UTAH

I. M. Bay, of Junction, Utah, bid lowest of nine concerns for construction of Boulder City's 8-room school house, which will be completed by next fall according to plans of the Bureau of Reclamation.

Bids were opened this morning at the Boulder City office of the bureau, the highest bid being nearly twice that of the lowest.

The nine bid figures will be sent to the Denver office for final decision as to awarding of the contract.

The school, architect's drawing of which was reproduced in the first anniversary edition of the Boulder Journal March 11, will be

built at the intersection of Utah street and Colorado, or about two blocks due west of the Six Companies hospital.
