NOW OCCUPIED

Ten More Families Move Into New Homes; 15 to Be Completed Thursday

With 85 out of 100 prospective government homes in Boulder City now occupied, the remaining 15 will be completed by next Thursday, and ready for occupancy, it is expected.

Ten more Bureau of Reclamation men with their families have moved into new homes recently finished by the De Camp Hudson company, and the remaining fifteen houses being built by the Los Angeles firm are due for completion August 18.

By the last of next week the total of 100 houses even, built on contract for the Bureau of Reclamation employes, all probably will be occupied, more than a dozen men yet living in the camp in Hemenway wash, the original camp, awaiting completion of the 34 man dormitory just east of the municipal building.
