

Dam Pack Train to Leave for Fair Now

H. R. (Bob) Wagner and Ellsworth E. Kerr, Tia Juana Eddie), both western characters, are going to drive and pack the original Boulder dam pack train that did practically all the packing for the engineers for a period of one year over the hazardous trails of the project, to the world's fair at Chicago, starting about November 25.

The outfit will consist of eight Spanish burros, four of them hooked up to a miniature prairie schooner with a water barrel trailer, the wagon to be a counterpart of the days of '49. Four burros will trail behind fully packed. One of the animals is a trick burro. They are taking a dog along, too, that can also do his bit.

"Bob and Tia Juana" plan to make a two-year trip, covering practically all the eastern states. They will have an assortment of pictures, also H. W. Gates' new book that vividly describes the possibility of the dam. "Tia Juana" is preparing a series of short talks about Las Vegas, Hidden Forest, the Lost City, metallics and non-metallics, manufacturing and opportunities, etc.

This unique and original idea is worthy of real consideration on the part of the chamber of commerce and the citizens of Las Vegas.

The "boys" promise to have the outfit on the streets for two or three days prior to their leaving.

Calico shirts, red ball boots, 10-gallon hats and corduroy breeches will complete the effect.
