

FASHIONABLE HOMES IN S. F. BURGLARIZED

Wave of Thefts Extending Over
Last Three Weeks Revealed,
Two in Sea Cliff District

Several burglaries in fashionable residential districts during the past two or three weeks were disclosed yesterday by police, but they denied that the city was experiencing any unusual wave of house-breaking.

Additional recent thefts included:

At the Felix Kahn home, 455 Sea Cliff Avenue, a prowler who climbed a drain pipe entered the chauffeur's room and took \$30.
