

Opera Star To Sing As Noted Hollywood Artist Weds in Skip Over Colorado River

Tony Mann, Illustrator, to Marry Radio Entertainer Sunday Morning

In a skip hanging 600 feet above the Colorado river on the Hoover dam workings, a Metropolitan Opera star's voice will be heard singing "I Love You Truly" tomorrow morning as a unique wedding ceremony is performed there in the heart of the dam project.

Tony Mann, Hollywood artist, will be the bridegroom and Miss Hilma Parkhurst, radio entertainer of Hollywood, will be the bride.

Mae V. Perry, Metropolitan Opera singer from New York, will sing as a feature of the wedding ceremony.

Little Barbara Mae Perry, daughter of Mae V. Perry and noted stage performer in her own right, will sing "Where the Silvery Colorado Winds Its Way," at the ceremony.

The wedding party will leave Boulder City about 9:30 a. m., for the canyon, and the ceremony will take place at 10 a. m.

The prospective bride and groom first met about four months ago in

Hollywood, the bridegroom being 32 and Miss Parkhurst 26. They will make their home in Hollywood after the wedding.

Mann has lived in Las Vegas much of the time recently. He is doing independent art direction work for the movies.

A wedding dinner will be given party at 12:30 Sunday in the mess-hall, with Harold Anderson as host. Las Vegas and Boulder City friends of the members of the party will be invited, it is planned.
