

Clark County to Get \$5,430 Relief Money From Sum Awarded by Government

Clark county will receive approximately \$5,430 in relief money from the \$47,200 loan granted today by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation to the state of Nevada, according to United Press dispatches from Reno.

The state relief committee, headed by Cecil Creel originally requested \$95,600, and upon receipt of the word that the amount applied for had been cut more than in half, Creel said the funds received would be pro-rated over the state in proportion to the amounts originally requested.

Clark county asked for \$11,000, and under the prevailing ratio will receive \$5,430.

Associated Press dispatches from Washington, telling of the Nevada loan, declare that one of the primary considerations in granting it, was the need existing in Clark county because of Boulder dam construction.

"An unusual labor situation exists in Clark county," the Associated Press quotes officials of the

Reconstruction Finance Corporation as stating. "This is due to the fact that many men and their families have been and are still being drawn to Clark county in expectation of finding work.

"These families are often left stranded with no prospect of employment and insufficient funds to go elsewhere," the statement said.

Granting of relief funds in the rest of the state is based almost entirely on crop failures, the corporation representatives stated, pointing to the fact that approximately 100 families will need partial relief during the fall and winter because of crop failures.

In granting the loan, the corporation heads said further that it was "to meet current needs in Clark, Washoe and White Pine counties."

This sum is to take care of relief work only until the first of the year, Creel stated, and he is hopeful of getting an additional loan between now and that time, he said.
