

# TREE PLANTING FOR COMMUNITY TO BE STARTED IN FEW WEEKS

ABOUT 2,000, PLAN

Two Year Landscaping  
Program Is Mapped Out

A tree-planting project designed to completely landscape Boulder City within the next two years will be started in a few weeks, under direction of W. W. Weed, chief landscape gardener under the bureau of reclamation.

Present plans call for planting of about 2,000 trees, a large share of which will have been planted by next summer.

Grading work around the administration building already has been started and Weed is expected to return early this week from Los Angeles with information as to what varieties of trees can be readily delivered, preparatory to early placing of orders that will be capable of being filled without delay.

The trees will be planted around residences first, to furnish shade at the earliest possible time for homes, it is planned. The present tentative plan worked out by the landscape architect during his first month in Boulder City calls for trees on both sides of all residence streets, as well as in the parks and plazas around the public buildings.

Sprinkling systems will be planned for the parks and plazas.

Small decorative trees will be used in the business district and fast-growing shade trees, possibly poplars, but not cottonwoods, will be used in the park and residential sections, according to bureau of reclamation officials.

Weed, who is a graduate landscape architect, has been in the nursery business in Portland, Oregon, having designed and planted many subdivisions there. He will move his family from Portland to one of the new government cottages in Boulder City in the spring.
