

# GOVERNMENT TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS ON EIGHT ROOM BUILDING

Plans for Building Arrive  
In Reclamation Offices  
In Boulder. 3/11/32

## SITE IS SELECTED

U. S. Appropriation May  
Run System After Per-  
manent House is Built.

Advertising for bids for Boul-  
der City's eight room school-  
house, to be built in time for oc-  
cupancy next fall, is expected  
soon, according to Bureau of  
Reclamation officials.

Whether or not the school will  
be operated by the federal govern-  
ment is to be determined by con-  
gress in the near future. Mean-  
while, plans for actual construction  
of the plant at the site set aside  
for it in Boulder City are going  
ahead.

With Senator Tasker L. Oddie  
seeking to procure an allotment  
of \$20,000 for maintenance and  
supplies and \$45,000 annually for  
operation of the school with gov-  
ernment funds.

Oddie also is seeking \$36,000 ap-  
propriation for construction of a  
dozen auxiliary rooms, in addition  
to \$45,000 for the permanent eight  
room building.

The school will be located in  
block 15, the whole of which has  
been set aside by the government  
for this use. Block 15 is situated  
just north of the park, near Utah,  
at a point a block and a half south  
of the government dormitory.

It is probable the school will pro-  
vide for only grammar school facil-  
ities, at least for the present, high  
school students to be sent to Las  
Vegas next year to school in all  
probability.

On November 11, a third of a  
year ago, an official survey showed  
289 children living in Boulder City,  
of whom 228 were of school age.  
Sixty were traveling to Las Vegas  
and about 85 were attending school  
in Boulder City.

These figures have swelled since  
that time, and there are now about  
120 students in the temporary  
Boulder City school system, with  
six teachers instead of three.
