

# SUCCESSFUL DAM BIDDERS ARE PAID TRIBUTE IN FRISCO

## Mayor Heads Delegation to Welcome Returning Contractors.

San Francisco, March 7. — (By United Press)—Headed by Mayor Angelo Rossi, San Francisco city officials made record time between the Ferry building and Third street depot, main railroad terminals, to welcome two groups of contractors returning from Denver, where the low bid won for Six Companies, Inc., the contract to build the Hoover dam.

The first group of engineers and contractors, including Kenneth Bechtel, of Kaiser & Bechtel, and Felix Kahn, of McDonald & Kahn, arrived at the Ferry building at 8 a. m.

After greeting this group, the delegation of officials, reinforced by friends and business associates, proceeded to another depot to meet another party in which were Earl G. Lloyd, of the Associated General Contractors of America, and E. O. Watis, second vice president of the "synthetic" Six Companies, composed of leading western building firms that banded together to bid for the project.

"It is fitting that we give these emissaries a royal welcome," Mayor Rossi said. "Their great business ability, fine records, and strong assets that obtained the building part of the 165-million-dollar project is a tribute to San Francisco.

"The city will be benefited in many ways as the contract progresses, for many of the most noted builders and engineers will come to San Francisco while the work is under way."

A meeting of executives and engineers of the company is scheduled for Monday. This will be a combination business meeting and occasion for the receipt of felicitations from friends of the lucky bidders.
